Geese Control

Last summer we had a number of complaints about the large geese population and their subsequent droppings in and near the lake.

After discussing various options with the Ohio Division of Wildlife, the HH Lake Committee has decided to take action in an attempt to control the geese population this year.

The HH Lake Association has hired professionals to search for nests and addle the eggs. This involves first obtaining a permit from the Ohio Division of Wildlife. Then a team of two will search the Baja and other common areas for nests. They will then shake the eggs which renders them unviable. The Ohio Division of Wildlife approves this method of population control.

You will see this team working at the end of March and the beginning of April. They will make several visits to the Lake. Please contact Siotkowski@sbcglobal.net with questions.
